“The Return of the Crosstown Tunnel?”

The City of San Francisco holds an exemption that allows them to discharge treated and partially treated wastewater into the Monterey Bay Marine Sanctuary. Currently, about 17 million gallons per day (more during wet weather) are discharged into this exemption area through a pipeline that reaches 4-and-a-half miles offshore.

Under consideration in the SF Public Utilities Commission's Master Plan process is an idea that was previously studied and never built; that is, sending all of the treated effluent to the ocean through a tunnel reaching from the Southeast Treatment Plant in the Bayview to the Oceanside Plant near the Zoo.

At our March meeting, we'll have a discussion of this proposal; why it keeps coming up, what it might mean for the Bay and Ocean, and how we can influence the decision of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission
